Hohenfels Training Area training advisory for Sep 10-20, 2016

HOHENFELS, Germany (Sep. 10, 2016)

This is an informational advisory for the communities around the Hohenfels Training Area. Times and locations of activities in this announcement may change due to weather conditions or as determined necessary by airspace authorities. This release is not all inclusive, it is meant to provide information about potential noise generating events for the local population.

The Schmidmuhlen Gate and road will reopen for civilian traffic in the early morning of Sep. 14, 2016. Residents and commuters are advised to continue using the bypass roads around the Hohenfels Training Area in the interim.

Units and vehicles participating in Exercise Combined Resolve VII will begin departing the Hohenfels Training Area beginning 14 Sep 2016. Between 14-20 Sep, there will be increased concentrations of military vehicle convoys between the US military training areas Hohenfels and Grafenwoehr, and Hohenfels and Parsberg. Military convoys will be strictly limited to the roads.

During this same period, there will be heavy armored vehicles between the military training area Hohenfels and the Parsberg rail station during early morning hours.

Due to the dimensions and weight of the vehicles, they will move slowly, and their visibility is limited. Motorists are advised when driving near military vehicle convoys to be especially careful.

The Joint Multinational Readiness Center is conscious of the impact that training activities have on the local community. We strive to be good members of the community and provide information about what we do. Whenever possible, we avoid training that will inconvenience the local community. We schedule the majority of our

training events during weekdays and normal workday hours. Some military training requires training during hours of darkness, and sometimes scheduling requires training on the weekends. The Hohenfels Training Area serves a wide variety of customers, Bundeswehr, Luftwaffe, U.S. military, other NATO Allies, and more. For more information, go to www.eur.army.mil/jmtc.
