



***Brigadier General Mark S. Hendrix – Commanding General
7th Civil Support Command***

Brigadier General Mark Hendrix is a 1980 graduate of the U.S. Military Academy and was commissioned as an Infantry officer. He served on active duty with the 1st Battalion, 48th Infantry in Germany, and with Infantry Training Group at Fort Benning, Georgia.

Upon joining Civil Affairs, he served as a team chief and detachment commander with the 418th Civil Affairs Battalion in Kansas City, Missouri. He deployed with that unit to the Balkans in 1997-1998 in support of OPERATION JOINT GUARD, serving as director of the Civil-Military Cooperation Center for the U.S. sector in Bosnia, and also as civil-military officer for Task Force Pershing in Slavonski Brod, Croatia.

After serving as the G-3 Plans officer for the 351st Civil Affairs Command, he commanded the 407th Civil Affairs Battalion in Minneapolis, Minnesota from 2000-2002. Following battalion command he served as a civil affairs staff officer at Headquarters, U.S. Special Operations Command, MacDill Air Force Base, Florida.

Upon promotion to colonel in 2004, he was assigned to the Joint Staff as senior operations officer for Operational Team Five in the National Military Command Center. During this assignment he deployed in support of OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM, serving as chief of staff and director of United Nations Coordination for the Joint Area Support Group at the U.S. Embassy in Baghdad. He then commanded the 308th Civil Affairs Brigade in Chicago from January 2006 until his selection for flag rank, and assumed command of the 350th CACOM in April 2008.

He is a graduate of both the Army and Air War Colleges, and the CAPSTONE Flag and General Officer Course. In civilian life he is an attorney in Missouri.
