Christopher Roscoe became Ammunition Center Europe Director in January 2015. Previously, he served 27 years in the Army as a logistics and combat arms officer, including former oversight of the 21st TSC Munitions Branch from 2009 to 2011, the 23rd Ordnance Company from 2007-2009, and the 1AD Division Ammunition Office from 2003-2004. His final military assignment was Commander of the 405th Army Field Support Brigade in Germany.

His military career included a diverse set of assignments, beginning as an Armor Platoon Leader, followed by selection in 1990 as XO of the 2AD (FWD) Canadian Army Trophy Tank Team and subsequent deployment to Desert Shield/Storm. Additional assignments included positions in heavy maintenance, comptrollership, aviation logistics, supply, intelligence, transportation, and installation logistics. Duty postings included Forts Benning, Leonard-Wood, Carson, Monroe and Leavenworth, and multiple European locations across Germany and Italy.

Deployments during Roscoe's military career include Operations Desert Shield/Desert Storm in 1991 as Tank Company XO; Somalia in 1993 as Brigade Maintenance Officer; OIF 1 (Baghdad) 2003-2004 as 1AD DMMC Chief; and OIF 08-10 (Mosul) 2008-2009 as Battalion Commander of the 18th Combat Sustainment Support Battalion.

His professional military education includes the Armor Basic Course, Ordnance Advanced Course, CAS3, Command and General Staff College, and a Senior Service College Fellowship at the George C Marshall Center.

Roscoe possesses a Bachelor of Science degree in Microbiology from Texas A&M University at College Station, and a Masters in Business Administration (Finance and Accounting) from the University of Illinois at Chicago. His military awards include the Legion of Merit with Oak Leaf Cluster, the Bronze Star with two Oak Leaf Clusters, the Combat Action Badge and Air Assault Badge. He has also been awarded the Samuel Sharpe Medal.
