## THE 7TH U.S. ARMY JOINT MULTINATIONAL TRAINING COMMAND

***"Prevent Conflict, Shape International Environment, Win Decisively"***

The 7th U.S. Army Joint Multinational Training Command, or JMTC, is the U.S. Army's only overseas training command. JMTC provides cutting-edge training and training support for U.S. and multi-national forces, enabling units to meet global requirements, maintain agile and ready soldiers, and generate cohesively trained formations capable of dominating in any operational environment. At the height of the current conflict more than 86 percent of the coalition forces deployed to Afghanistan were provided by European allies and partners and trained at JMTC. Using NATO and International Security Assistance Forces-approved standards, JMTC delivered Counter-Improvised Explosive Device training to more than 5,000 multi-national Soldiers, since 2010.

### ***The JMTC European forward-based training platform***

The JMTC provides a unique, state-of-the-art training platform. U.S. and NATO forces, coalition partners and allies build and sustain increased operational capacity during complex, mission-specific training rehearsals and exercises. JMTC's close-proximity to multi-national partners makes it a cost-effective and easily accessible option for training and training support, and European and Asian partners have undoubtedly made JMTC's, Europe-based ranges and facilities an unrivaled choice to support International Security Force Assistance programs and initiatives.

***Maneuver and Gunnery*** — The Joint Multinational Readiness Center, JMRC, is adjacent to the Hohenfels Training Area, which contains 163 Square Kilometers of maneuver space and facilitates challenging-realistic combat training from the individual- to-brigade level. Also, the nearby Grafenwoehr Training Area consists of 233 Square Kilometers of gunnery and maneuver area, has 44 modern, computerized live-fire ranges, and the Army's only 360-degree combat outpost training facility.

***Simulations*** — Joint Multinational Simulation Center, also known as JMSC, offers state-of-the-art virtual, constructive and gaming training support to units throughout Europe, with reach-back capabilities to the U.S. and abroad.

***Military Specialty Training*** — The Combined Arms Training Center, CATC, provides advanced functional training to enhance Soldier's basic, tactical and technical competence at the individual level.

***Training aids and devices*** — The Training Support Activity Europe, or TSAE, provides home-station training support to units stationed in 18 cities and six countries in Germany, Italy, Belgium, Netherlands, Romania, and Bulgaria.

***Leadership*** — ***7th U.S. Army Noncommissioned Officers Academy***, also known as 7th Army NCOA, is the U.S. Army's oldest and largest academy, developing U.S. and partnered nations' junior leaders in Europe for more than 60 years.

### ***The JMTC by the numbers***

- Almost 6,000 multi-national Soldiers have completed Operational Mentor and Liaison Team and Police Operational Mentor and Liaison Team training at JMRC, since 2009.
- To date, during fiscal year 12, JMSC planned, prepared, and executed 11 Brigade and Battalion Command Post Exercises, supported 288 training events that improved the combat readiness of 9,226 U.S. service members and 3,398 participants from 33 nations.
- Approximately 4,000 multi-national Soldiers received specialized functional training at the CATC, since 2003.
- During fiscal year 11, almost 16,000 home station training and non-rotational training events and multi-national exercises were executed by TSAE, training almost 500,000 U.S. Service members and multi-national forces. In total, more than 33 nations were supported during the fiscal year.
- More than 600 International Military Students from 27 different countries graduated the Warrior Leader Course at the 7th Army NCOA, since 2003.

***For almost 60 years, the U.S. Army in Europe trained alongside its European partners to promote peace and stability. The Decisive Action Training Environment synthesizes the power of those partnerships to prepare for and prevent future conflicts, while shaping the international environment, and preserving stability in the region.***
