Atlantic Resolve

Armored and Aviation Brigade Rotations:

- Nine-month rotations scheduled into the foreseeable future
- Enhances the deterrence capabilities, increases ability to respond to potential crises and defend our allies and partners in the European community
- Remains under U.S. command
- Focuses on strengthening capabilities and sustaining readiness through bilateral and multinational training exercises

4th Infantry Division, Mission Command Element:

- Regionally aligned division headquarters for Europe since 2015, based in Poznan, Poland
- Oversees rotational units, tactical headquarters for more than 5,000 U.S. land forces
- Provides U.S. Army Europe a division-level mission command capability

3rd Armored Brigade Combat Team, 4th Infantry Division:

- Arrived in January 2017 from Fort Carson, Colorado
- Brought approximately 3,500 personnel and 87 tanks, 18 Paladins; 419 Humvee variants; 144 Bradley Fighting Vehicles; (446 tracked vehicles, 907 wheeled vehicles, 650 trailers)
- First armored brigade combat team continuous presence and back-to-back rotations of U.S. troops and equipment

10th Combat Aviation Brigade:

- Arrived Feb. 12, 2017, from Fort Drum, New York, with approximately 10 Chinooks, 50 Black Hawks and 1,800 Soldiers
- Headquartered in Illesheim, Germany, with forward positioned aircraft in task forces in Latvia, Poland and Romania
- Black Sea persistent and continuous presence
- Continued investment in the training and mission command capabilities at Novo Selo Training Area, Bulgaria, and Mihail Kogalniceanu Air Base, Romania

497th Combat Sustainment Support Battalion:

- More than 750 personnel and 160 pieces of equipment deployed to enhance logistical support for Operation Atlantic Resolve
- Based in Poland and has logistics hubs in Lithuania and Romania
- The 16th Sustainment Brigade has mission command over the CSSB
- Combination of 17 active duty, Army Reserve and National Guard units
- Comprised of various types of sustainment assets to include ammunition handlers, military police, movement control teams, truck drivers, maintenance, supply, postal, fuelers (POL), and other specialties to support the rotational combat brigades and other efforts in the theater
