Overview:

- The sixth rotation of an aviation brigade in support of Atlantic Resolve
- Arrives July 2020, from Fort Campbell, Kentucky
- Replaces 3rd Combat Aviation Brigade, 3rd Infantry Division, from Hunter Army Airfield, Georgia
- Brings approximately
 - 2,000 personnel
 - 50 UH-60 and HH-60 Black Hawks
 - 4 CH-47 Chinooks
 - 25 AH-64 Apaches
 - More than 1,800 wheeled vehicles and pieces of equipment

Deployment:

- Sea transportation includes two vessels with more than 1,800 pieces of equipment
- Aircraft, wheeled vehicles and other equipment is scheduled to arrive in July in La Rochelle, France, and Alexandroupoli, Greece
- Equipment that arrives in La Rochelle and Alexandroupoli is scheduled to move by commercial line-haul, military convoy and aerial movements to designated locations across the theater

Locations:

- Units will be distributed across the region, to include: Illesheim, Germany; Stefanovikio, Greece; Lielvarde, Latvia; Powidz, Poland; Mihail Kogalniceanu, Romania; and Incirlik Air Force Base, Turkey

Rotation:

- As part of Atlantic Resolve, U.S.-based units deploy to Europe for nine-month rotations
- Rotational units conduct bilateral, joint and multinational training events in the Atlantic Resolve areas of operation with allies and partners from across 18 countries to include: Belgium, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Georgia, Germany, Great Britain, Greece, Hungary, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Romania and Slovakia
- Rotational units focus on strengthening bonds between allies and partners, increasing interoperability and building readiness

The deployment of ready, combat-credible U.S. forces to Europe in support of Atlantic Resolve is evidence of the strong and unremitting U.S. commitment to NATO and Europe. Through bilateral, joint and multinational training, Atlantic Resolve builds readiness, increases interoperability and enhances the bond between ally and partner militaries.
